- 1a) Compose a phrase in two part harmony, using the perfect fourth as a dissonance.
- 1b) Compose a phrase in two part harmony using the perfect fourth as a consonance.
- 2) Compose a phrase in two part harmony incorporating a gradual increase of interval tension. The increase should not be overly simple/linear.
- 3) Compose phrases for three instruments of the same family, using:
 - a) mirror chords, using equidistant intervals;
 - b) chords with mixed intervals, but maintaining the same degree of intervallic tension, e.g. each chord might contain one strong dissonance, one open consonance, and one soft consonance.
